

HOW WILL YOU COME TO KARIMA AND LEAVE?

Walk, cycle or get dropped off in a vehicle. Please be mindful of our neighbours.

Collection –. students will be free to leave once lessons have finished



PARKING

There is limited on street parking. Please park safely

Please park your car without causing any inconvenience to our neighbours.

Parking spaces are available at Laburnum Road and Middle Way (Opposite Castlefield School).

Please walk children into the carpark where needed and do not convene on the pathway.

Please also leave promptly after dropping off and collecting your child to free up parking spaces for other parents.



SETTLING IN AND WELLBEING

The first week back will be used for children to settle into the routines and get to know their teachers.

We understand that some of our children may not have been a part of the Karima School before now, so teachers will take their time to make sure that the children settle in well- insha Allah



UNIFORM

Boys Uniform:

A plain white Jubba with trousers (no jeans) and a grey colour hat/kufi.

Girls Uniform:

A plain black closed Jilbab that covers the ankles with loose black trousers or shalwar (no leggings or jeans) and a grey hijab.



STUDY AND BEHAVIOUR

Please ensure that children perform wudu before coming to classes.

Please also help the children at home with supervised study time. If you have any queries about your child's work please communicate through the homework diary, speak to a member of staff after lessons or email Ustadh Bilal.

We have high expectations of all our students and promote empathy and awareness of those around them at all times.

We have a stepped approach at Karima for sanctions including: lines, privilege removal, chores and detentions -

- 15 minutes without notice
- 30 minutes detentions with 24hrs notice given to parents



EXPECTATIONS OF STUDENTS

Respect for knowledge – we expect students to strive and persevere in each of their lessons. Remembering that Islam isn't only for 1 day a week

Pure intentions – seek knowledge for the pleasure of Allah and not to show off to others.

Act upon what you know – the entire purpose is to apply what you learn.

Re-visit their lessons – It is important for students to spend time at home memorizing or revising their work.

Good manners towards all teachers and respectful towards other pupils

Adhere strictly to the dress code

Not to take their phones or other electronics out unless for work purposes with the permission of a teacher

Be patient!

(Students should come in each week in a state of having wudu)



ABSENCES & HOLIDAY

Attendance to all lessons is compulsory unless due to sickness. If attendance drops your child's place is at risk.

Holidays must be restricted to Karima school holiday time ONLY. If you need to apply for a holiday please get in touch before booking anything else, otherwise you risk losing your child's place at the school.

All absences need to be reported to Ustadh Bilal before 9am on the day they will not be in. If this does not happen, it will be recorded as an Unauthorised Absence and your child's place on the programme will be at risk.

All students must be in class for 9am. Persistent late comers will also be at risk of loosing their place at the school.
